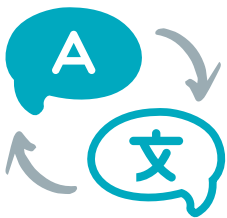

What you can expect from us:

- You will speak to a qualified counsellor who will support you into accommodation
- You will be treated with respect and without judgement
- Qualified counsellors who will speak with you about ways of addressing violent and abusive behaviour
- Qualified counsellors who will refer you to services such as mental health, drug and alcohol, the Caring Dads program and Men's Behaviour Change Programs.

What we expect from you:

- Treat us with respect
- Engage with accommodation, counselling and other supports related to your use of family and domestic violence
- Keep your counsellor updated if your circumstances change.

The Men's Accommodation and Counselling Service is operated in partnership by No to Violence and The Salvation Army.

Both organisations have qualified counsellors who will listen to you, find out more about your situation and give you the advice and support you need.

If you have a support person, advocate or representative you are welcome to bring that person into the program to support your decision making. This process can be discussed at your initial intake session.

Who is this service for?

People who have used family or domestic violence and:

- Have been excluded (via a Family Violence Intervention Order or Family Violence Safety Notice) from the home due to family violence
- Are in need of crisis accommodation
- Are interested in engaging in counselling support to address their behaviour.
